 Treat UA instructors and administrative staff members, your peers, as well as external visitors with whom you may interact during your studies with politeness.


 Refrain from engaging in or committing any form of misconduct: refrain from any anti-social behavior (such as spitting, etc.); refrain from any harmful or violent behavior (such as harassment, bullying, etc.).


 Bear responsibility for your conduct.

 Pay attention not to take any action that could bring the University into disrepute or disrupt its activities.

 Be suitably dressed while observing decency.

 Nurture good hygiene practices and maintain a clean-cut appearance.


 Laugh with each other, not at each other.


 Show respect for University property and report to the concerned people if you notice that something is damaged.


 Smoke in designated areas only.


 Demonstrate respect for the natural environment.
