

Institutional History



Fr. Louis Rohban, Rector (1997-2005)

The torch was then passed on to Abbot Antoine Rajeh, who started promoting the University's publications until it received authorization to establish a publishing house in 2009.

In 2007, the cornerstone of the third branch of the University was inaugurated in Mejdlaya–Zgharta and classes commenced on March 27, 2009.

With the far-reaching vision of the Antonine Maronite Order, which extends beyond welcoming student brothers into its ranks, the Order has strived to establish a university since the 1960s. However, this desire remained unfulfilled until October 5, 1996, when a decree signed by the Presidency of the Council of Ministers granted Antonine University the right to create several faculties and institutes under the leadership of Fr. Louis Rohban.

During his mandate, Antonine University set up a branch in Zahle–Bekaa, enabling young generations to pursue their higher-education goals and have a positive impact on their communities.

In 2011, the leadership of the University was handed over to Fr. Germanos Germanos. In this period, significant achievements included the expansion and rearrangement of the campus, with separate buildings being allocated for each faculty and major renovation projects being launched.

In addition, a new monastery was built overlooking the University, serving as a gathering place to celebrate Antonine University's milestones and unite the internal and external communities through religious and cultural events.

On an academic level, the greatest accomplishment was the launch of the institutional accreditation process in conformity with the standards established by the Swiss Agency of Accreditation and Quality Assurance.

Fr. Michel Jalakh, Rector (2017-23)

In 2017, Fr. Michel Jalakh initiated his six-year mandate with a clear purpose: to transform the University into a student-centered institution.

By revising its mission, vision, and values, he aimed to strengthen the University's unflinching commitment to societal transformation. A great deal of success was achieved through the establishment of the Vice Rectorate for Integral Human Development, responsible for fostering a culture that supports mental health and well-being; the Vice Rectorate for Administration, overseeing the administrative affairs of both faculty and staff members; and the Vice Rectorate for Cooperation and Internationalization, focusing on staff capacity building and faculty and student mobility.

Furthermore, the culmination of the journey toward excellence was in 2017, when Antonine University was granted institutional accreditation by the Swiss Agency of Accreditation and Quality Assurance. This milestone was followed by an accreditation awarded to the Department of Physical Therapy by the World Physiotherapy in 2018 and another one to the Faculty of Music and Musicology programs by the European agency Music Quality Enhancement in 2020. Despite the country's unprecedented collapse over the past years, Fr. Jalakh's primary preoccupation was to navigate the crisis and manage the unavoidable and extreme uncertainty generated in such tough times, while ensuring that the University maintains high educational standards for its undergraduate and graduate programs.

second campus. Initially established in Zahle-Bekaa, it was later relocated to Nabi Ayla-Zahle on lands owned by the Antonine Maronite Order. By establishing its second site in the region, the Order reaffirms its non-sectarian nature and its commitment to decentralization. By taking this step, the University also addressed the educational challenges faced by the residents of Bekaa, providing them with the opportunity to pursue higher education and make a meaningful contribution to their communities.



Under the direction of the General Superior of the Antonine Maronite Order and the supervision of the Board of Trustees, Antonine University is led by the Rector, who is assisted by the Administrative Council.

Since its establishment, Antonine University has remained committed to providing quality education, promoting interdisciplinary and contextualized research, and enhancing the sustainable well-being of its local and global communities. In order to carry out its mission, the University embraces a shared governance model, with single-member bodies, comprising the Rectorate, deans of faculties, and directors of departments, and collegial bodies, including the Administrative Council, Academic Committee, and faculty and department councils.



Antonine University Statutes

These bodies collaborate under responsible management, with distinct roles defined by the *Organic Statute*.

The Rectorate holds senior oversight of the institution and consists of the Rector, Secretary General, Bursar, Vice Rector for Academic Affairs, Vice Rector for Research, Vice Rector for Administration, Vice Rector for Integral Human Development, Vice Rector for Cooperation and Internationalization, and Director of the Office of Strategic Initiatives and Quality Assurance. These members jointly address important matters and keep each other informed about changes within their areas of responsibility.

Moreover, Antonine University's governing bodies are responsible for drafting statutes, engaging in the policy-making process, implementing and prioritizing the strategic plan and initiatives aligned with the University's core values, in addition to managing its administration and finances, and monitoring progress toward institutional objectives defined by the Antonine University Council.

Board of Trustees

The Superior General of the Antonine Maronite Order serves as the Antonine University Chancellor and is responsible for ensuring the University's compliance with applicable laws and prescriptions of competent authorities. The Order's Supreme Council, consisting of the Superior General and the four Assistants, along with the Rector, form the Board of Trustees. These members are legally entitled to elect individuals to join the Board as members, provided that the total number of members does not exceed 15.

The Board of Trustees holds the authority to oversee the University's general operations, assess its performance, identify and manage strategic risks and opportunities, and formulate strategies to support Antonine University's educational activities and promote sustainable development. It also has the power to promulgate rules and regulations to ensure compliance with legal obligations, approve the *Organic Statute* and make necessary amendments, and approve Antonine University's mission, vision, values, and strategic plan. Additionally, the Board of Trustees provides oversight for internal and external audits, manages yearend closing, financial statements, and the annual budget, and exercises control over waqf properties, buildings, assets, donations, and scholarships.



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Governance

Antonine University Council

The University Council is primarily responsible for establishing a strategic direction that aligns with the rules and regulations of the *Organic Statute* and the policies of the Board of Trustees. It provides a roadmap for achieving institutional objectives, outlines a compelling vision for the future of the Institution, monitors progress towards desired goals, and ensures that governance processes are appropriate. The Council has the authority to decide on the system of studies and examinations to be adopted by the University.

According to the *Organic Statute*, which governs the composition and authority of the Council, this oversight body consists of the Rector, who chairs it, Secretary General, Bursar, Chaplain, vice rectors, directors and administrative directors of regional campuses, deans of faculties, heads of departments, Director of the Office of Orientation and Admissions, Director of the Language Center, as well as faculty and student representatives.

The Rector is the highest authority of Antonine University and is elected by the General Council of the Antonine Maronite Order.

He holds office for a renewable mandate of six years and serves as the spokesperson for the Order and the Board of Trustees within the University. Additionally, the Rector acts as the legal representative of Antonine University externally. In his capacity as chair of the Rectorate, he is assisted in the performance of his duties by the Administrative Council. The members of the Administrative Council exercise their delegated authority in their respective areas of expertise as determined by the Rector.

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The primary mission of the Rector is to ensure that the Institution operates under the principles of collegiality and transparency. Special emphasis is placed on strategic leadership and providing a student-centered education system while maintaining the University's strong reputation. Moreover, the Rector presides over the councils and committees that are considered the most important, where decisive and unified actions are taken.

Secretary General

Office of Orientation and Admissions

The Office of Orientation and Admissions takes great joy in guiding scholars as they make decisions about their career paths and choose a university where they can have a fulfilling educational experience. The Office is committed to warmly welcoming students and their parents and ensuring a smooth transition from secondary school to university.

The primary objective of this Office is to accompany students throughout the admissions process, facilitating a mutually beneficial academic journey at Antonine University. It aims to reach and attract students who recognize the value of top-notch education quality, international experience, and a well-tailored curriculum, all while considering financial burdens. The Office of Orientation and Admissions actively highlights the unique experience Antonine University offers to prospective students, fostering a sense of trust and connection with the institution. Office of Examinations

The Office of Examinations is part of the operational departments of the academic support and examinations section at Antonine University.

The main responsibility of this Office is the organization of the exams. For this reason, it acts as the central location for receiving any claims, requests, admission, and non-admission to exams, controlling deadlines, and issuing and handing out certificates and notices. Additionally, the Office of Examinations guides Antonine University students through exam procedures and devises examination and study regulations.



Office of the Registrar

The mission of the Office of the Registrar is to provide faculties, administration, students, and alumni with all the services required, professionally and ethically. This involves collaborating with the Antonine University Administration and meeting the needs of all users while respecting the confidentiality of the files under its accountability.

The Office of the Registrar secures its efforts to address enrollment problems by ensuring students have access to accurate information and instructions regarding administrative policies and developing innovative solutions to cater to students' diverse needs.

Bursar

The Bursar, appointed by the Chancellor upon the proposal of the Rector, plays a crucial role in ensuring the Institution's financial sustainability and managing its financial resources and fixed assets.

In addition to fostering an ethical environment, the Bursar is responsible for various tasks. These include handling accounts payable and receivable processes, disbursing payrolls and financial aid, setting strategic financial goals, assisting with annual budget creation, overseeing cost management, and helping students meet their financial obligations.

Related Units

Accounting Department

The Accounting Department is responsible for maintaining accurate financial records and ensuring compliance with financial regulations. By upholding transparency and integrity in all financial processes, the Department actively supports the Institution's financial stability and growth.

Logistics and Services Department

Vice Rectorates

Vice Rectorate for Academic Affairs

The Vice Rector for Academic Affairs assists and represents the Rector in the governance and development of education at Antonine University.

In accordance with the *Organic Statute*, the *Rules and Regulations of the Faculty Members*, and the *Academic Affairs Rules and Regulations*, the Vice Rector for Academic Affairs is responsible for developing and updating academic policies, ensuring their implementation, chairing the Curriculum Committee, coordinating the work of the Academic Committee, supervising the continuing education process, and supporting the teaching evaluation and programs review processes.

Related Units

Academic Committee

The Academic Affairs Rules and Regulations have established the Academic Committee as a body derived from the Antonine University Council to focus on the teaching component. The Academic Committee is delegated authority by the Antonine University Council to make decisions on academic policies, academic system reforms, and learning programs. It also addresses a wide range of common and ongoing academic issues that are brought to its attention.

Curriculum Committee

In accordance with the Academic Affairs Rules and Regulations, the Curriculum Committee provides advisory opinions on proposed new curricula, as well as periodic and/or exceptional revisions and updates to existing curricula. The Committee's evaluation is based on the submitted curriculum guidelines and focuses on the structure and design of these projects.

Center for Accompaniment in University Pedagogy and Integration

This Center plays a primary role in contributing to the continuous improvement of teaching and learning quality. Through fostering pedagogical innovation and offering tailored support, it actively contributes to the professional development of the faculty members within the Institution.

Office of Strategic Initiatives and Quality Assurance

The Office of Strategic Initiatives and Quality Assurance oversees the development and ensures the implementation of the Antonine University strategic plan. It mainly focuses on all aspects related to quality assurance and continuous improvement in governance, teaching, research, student life, and other related services and resources. It also works to create a culture of quality within the University and provides logistical, administrative, and methodological support to various departments in their efforts toward continuous improvement. Moreover, the Office of Strategic Initiatives and Quality Assurance is responsible for planning and executing strategic initiatives, as well as managing their communication and assessing their impact both internally and externally on relevant stakeholders.



Ongoing Initiatives



Equality

Antonine University has adopted a policy that supports the respect for and promotion of gender equality. For this purpose, the Office of Strategic Initiatives and Quality Assurance is leading the Parity Committee, a think tank dedicated to monitoring the implementation of the gender equality policy across all units within the University.

This Committee aims to evaluate the policy's impact, combat gender stereotypes, and address the glass ceiling effect. It also seeks to deepen the institutional reflection that began in 2017 by identifying methods of reducing the gender gap in all faculties and departments and, ultimately, submitting an evaluation report to the Rector on the impact of this policy.



Social Responsibility

Antonine University has launched various initiatives related to the University's Social Responsibility.

In this context, the Office of Strategic Initiatives and Quality Assurance is coordinating the efforts among various stakeholders and parties involved in these initiatives, as well as developing a strategic plan for their implementation.

Vice Rectorate for Research

The Vice Rector for Research is in charge of one of the three pillars of Antonine University's mission, which is to promote interdisciplinary and contextualized scientific research. This involves anchoring research themes within the local and regional sociocultural context to address societal needs and ensure the societal impact of research. Antonine University strives for excellence in research across various fields that contribute to the Sustainable Development Goals, in order to advance knowledge and innovation and enhance visibility and reputation.

The Vice Rector for Research actively fosters sustainable solutions to socio-economic problems and global challenges, forging partnerships with governmental and non-governmental organizations,

as well as industry, to support local and regional economic development. His responsibilities include regulating and promoting research activities, elaborating the University's research strategy, securing funding for scientific research, facilitating collaborations with enterprises, ensuring research ethics policies, and providing information resources to researchers and students through the Antonine University Library.

Related Units

Scientific Research Council

The Scientific Research Council reviews and deliberates democratically on various documents submitted by the Vice Rector for Research, either through consensus or voting. This includes determining the University's proposed research strategy, evaluating annual projects of autonomous research units, assessing the provisional budgets of the Vice Rector for Research and research allocation, establishing general guidelines and standards for scientific publications and events organized by Antonine University, and proposing annual plans for electronic information resources available to Antonine University researchers.

Ethics Committee

The Ethics Committee promotes and reinforces the ethical values outlined in Antonine University's mission by ensuring their implementation within different units, taking into account the specific context and form of the disciplines taught. The Committee also focuses on the research component, recognizing its importance in producing knowledge that benefits society as a whole. For this purpose, Antonine University has developed standards to ensure that research participants are treated according to ethical principles, namely respect for individuals, their privacy, and their well-being, as well as consideration of human dignity and justice. The Ethics Committee also addresses the importance of respecting intellectual property at Antonine University, particularly in relation to teaching duties and knowledge production. In its advisory capacity, the Committee may offer guidance on ethics-related matters pertaining to academic and administrative governance.

The Antonine University Press is dedicated to producing literary, artistic, and technological publications created by research units and faculties at Antonine University.

These publications include periodicals, collective works, individual works in both print and electronic formats, as well as CDs, audio and video recordings, and scientific data.

The Antonine University Press focuses on publishing research results from within the University's academic units, including peer-reviewed periodicals, conference proceedings, monographs, and textbooks for teaching purposes.

Antonine University publications cater to both national and international audiences, depending on the subject matter or artistic nature of the works.

Library




Message From the Dean







The Choir has had the privilege of performing at the legendary Carnegie Hall in New York, the most prestigious concert stage in the United States, on three occasions: in May 2010, April 2013, and May 2015. The Choir also made its debut in Los Angeles in April 2014, performing at the LA City Hall.

In November 2016, the Choir made its first appearance at the San Carlo Opera House.

One of the Choir's notable achievements was representing Lebanon at the opening of the Lebanese Pavilion at the 57th Venice Biennale in May 2017. In 2019, the Antonine University Choir had the honor of performing at the Amazon Theatre, an opera house in Manaus, Brazil, for the Coimbra Brazilian University Congress.

Toufic Maatouk is widely recognized as one of the most compelling conductors of his generation. As an Antonine University alumnus, he was appointed Artistic Director and Choir Master of the Antonine University Choir in August 2005. Additionally, he has served as a Guest Conductor for the Lebanese Philharmonic Orchestra since 2013 and the Romanian Radio Chamber Orchestra since 2017.

Furthermore, he has held the position of Head of the Academy of the Saudi Music Hubs in Riyadh. Currently, he is the Deputy Executive Director at the Abu Dhabi Music and Arts organization and the Abu Dhabi Festival, as well as an Academic Board member of the Global Leaders Institute in Washington DC.

Overview

The Antonine Sports Club was founded on February 24, 1975, by the Antonine Maronite Order to promote its values through sports and physical activities.

During the Lebanese civil war, which began a few months after the Club's establishment, and despite the suspension of all federal sports activities, the Antonine Fathers decided to organize sporting events to bring people together. Led by Reverend Fr. Elie Abdel Massih, the Club transformed the Baabda Hill into a venue where Lebanese athletes played sports while others engaged in war play.

Alongside a group of coaches, trainers, and fathers, such as Fr. Etienne Barakat, Mr. Antoine Zayek, Mr. Raymond Naccour, Mr. Masanori Fukami, Mr. Serge Raffi, among others, the Club focused on athletics, basketball, volleyball, table tennis, judo and Kungfu.



Despite the violence and challenges, the Antonine Sports Club managed to organize a series of events and competitions, including the 24-hour relay with Marseille University in June 1980, the Beirut Marathon in April 1983, the Veterans' Athletics Championships in 1986, and the Marathon of Hope in 1986. The organization of the 200 x 1000m event even earned them a place in the Guinness Book of World Records for sports events.

After the end of the Lebanese civil war, the Club continued its efforts to promote sports and participate in various Lebanese sports championships. The Antonine teams became renowned for their athletic prowess, particularly the volleyball team, which competed in the Lebanese first division championship for many years. In 2017, the basketball team achieved promotion to the Lebanese first division league but was subsequently relegated to the second division.

Most recently, the Club won the 2022–23 Lebanese basketball second division championship, securing its position among the top basketball teams set to compete in the 2023–24 Lebanese first division league.


